Nevada Department of Native American Affairs Invites Public Review of New Strategic Plan

CARSON CITY, Nev. – The Nevada Department of Native American Affairs (DNAA) is pleased to announce the release of its newly drafted Strategic Plan, designed to guide the agency’s priorities and initiatives over the next five years.

The Department is now inviting members of the public, Tribal governments, Tribal organizations, and all stakeholders to review the plan and provide feedback during an official 30-day public comment period.

The Strategic Plan outlines key goals and action steps aimed at strengthening government-to-government relationships with Nevada’s 28 federally recognized Tribal Nations, Bands, and Colonies by enhancing cultural preservation, expanding educational opportunities, supporting economic development, and ensuring equitable access to state services including health and education.

“This plan reflects careful planning to define priorities and the metrics we will use to ensure progress,” said Stacey Montooth, Executive Director of the Nevada Department of Native American Affairs. “We believe it sets a clear path forward for advancing the needs of Nevada’s Native communities, and Tribal citizens, however public input is vital to make it an even stronger plan.”
