Establishment of the Nevada Tribal Health Authority Council

Nevada Senate Bill 312 created the Nevada Tribal Health Authority Council (Council). The Council empowers Nevada's federally recognized Tribes by giving them a direct voice in state healthcare policy, aiming to strengthen Tribal health systems and address severe health disparities. This new Nevada law establishes the Council to address healthcare disparities and advise Nevada law makers and policy advisors on Native American health issues. The Council also may contribute and request at least two Bill Draft Requests (BDRs) per legislative session to advocate for and address the healthcare needs of American Indians. Additionally, the Council and the DHHS collaborate to develop programs reinvesting certain federal Medicaid funds specifically for American Indian health services. This new law empowers recognized Tribal governments to independently determine if a person is presumptively eligible for Medicaid.

Voting Members: The director (or their designated representative) of each health care facility located in Nevada (16) that is operated by a Tribal Government opting to participate.

Non-Voting Members: One representative from the regional Indian Health Service office that oversees Nevada, plus appointed liaisons from Nevada Department of Human Services and Nevada Health Authority, whose functions relate to healthcare.
